


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

- B 60 [62:64:66:68:70]cm (23³/₄ [24¹/₂:25¹/₄:26:26³/₄:27¹/₂]")
- C 20 [22:24:25:26:27]cm (8 [834:91/2:934:101/4:1034]")
- D 18 [19:19:20:20:20]cm (7 [7½:7½:8:8:8]")
- E 9 [9:10:10:10:10]cm (3½ [3½:4:4:4:4]")
- F 18 [19:20:21:22:23]cm (7 [7½:8:8¼:8¾:9]")
- G 49 [49:50:51:51:51]cm (191/4 [191/4:193/4:20:20:20]")
- H 14 [15:16:17:18:19]cm (5½ [6:6¼:6½:7:7½]")

STITCHES & ABBREVIATIONS

alt - alternate

BACK

Using 3¹/₄mm needles and thumb method cast on 119 [133:147:159: 173:185] sts.

Ist Row. * KI, pI, rep from * to last st, kI.

2nd Row. PI, * kI, pI, rep from * to end.

Ist and 2nd rows set $I \times I$ rib. Work in $I \times I$ rib for 6cm, $(2\frac{1}{2}in)$, ending with a rs row.

Next Row. Rib 3 [2:5:1:1:1], rib2tog, (rib 20 [16:13:12:11:10], rib2tog) 5 [7: 9:11:13:15] times, rib 4 [3:5:2:1:2]. 113 [125:137:147:159:169] sts.

Change to 4mm needles and proceed as follows:-

Ist Row. * KI, pI, rep from * to last st, kI.

2nd Row. PI, * kI, pI, rep from * to end.

3rd Row. As 2nd row.

4th Row. * KI, pI, rep from * to last st, kI.

From 1st to 4th row sets double moss-st.

Working in double moss-st (throughout) cont until back measures 37 [37:37:38:39:40]cm, ($14\frac{1}{2}$ [$14\frac{1}{2}$: $14\frac{1}{2}$: $15\frac{15}{2}$: $15\frac{3}{4}$]in), ending with a ws row.

SHAPE ARMHOLES

Cast off 8 [8:9:9:10:10] sts in patt at

beg of next 2 rows. 97 [109:119: 129:139:149] sts.

Work 2 [6:6:10:12:14] rows dec 1 st at each end of every row. 93 [97:107: 109:115:121] sts.

Work 9 [7:9:7:9:11] rows dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll alt row. 83 [89:97:101:105:109] sts. **

Cont without shaping until armholes measure 15 [17:18:19:20:21]cm, (6 [6½: 7:7½:8:8¼]in), ending with a ws row.

Work 14 [14:18:18:18] rows more.

SHAPE SHOULDERS

Cast off 4 [4:5:5:6:6] sts in patt at beg of next 2 rows.

75 [81:87:91:93:97] sts.

SHAPE SHOULDERS AND BACK NECK

Cast off 4 [4:5:5:6:6] sts in patt, patt 14 [16:18:19:19:21], turn, leave rem 56 [60:63:66:67:69] sts on a stitch holder.

Working on these 15 [17:19:20: 20:22] sts only proceed as follows:-

Next Row. Patt.

Next Row. Cast off 4 [5:5:6:6:6] sts in patt, patt to last 2 sts, patt2tog. 10 [11:13:13:13:15] sts.

Next Row. Patt2tog, patt to end. 9 [10:12:12:14] sts.

Next Row. Cast off 4 [5:6:6:6:7] sts in patt, patt to end. 5 [5:6:6:6:7] sts.

Next Row. Patt.

Cast off rem 5 [5:6:6:6:7] sts in patt. Working on rem 56 [60:63:66: 67:69] sts, slip 37 [39:39:41:41:41] sts onto a stitch holder, rejoin yarn to rem 19 [21:24:25:26:28] sts and patt to end.

Next Row. Cast off 4 [4:5:5:6:6] sts in patt, patt to last 2 sts, patt2tog. 14 [16:18:19:19:21] sts.

Next Row. Patt2tog, patt to end. 13 [15:17:18:18:20] sts.

Next Row. Cast off 4 [5:5:6:6:6] sts in patt, patt to end.

9 [10:12:12:14] sts.

Next Row. Patt.

Next Row. Cast off 4 [5:6:6:6:7] sts in patt, patt to end. 5 [5:6:6:6:7] sts.

Next Row. Patt.

Cast off rem 5 [5:6:6:7] sts in patt.

FRONT

Work as given for Back to **.

Cont without shaping until armholes measure 15 [17:18:19:20:21]cm,

(6 $[6\frac{1}{2}:7:7\frac{1}{2}:8:8\frac{1}{4}]$ in), ending with a ws row.

SHAPE NECK

Next Row. Patt 28 [30:34:35:38:40], turn, slip rem 55 [59:63:66:67:69] sts onto a stitch holder.

Working on these 28 [30:34:35: 38:40] sts only proceed as follows:-

Next Row. Patt.

Work 2 rows dec I st at neck edge in every row. 26 [28:32:33:36:38] sts.

Work 9 [9:9:9:11:11] rows dec I st at neck edge in next and every foll alt row. 21 [23:27:28:30:32] sts.

Work I [1:5:5:3:3] rows without shaping.

SHAPE SHOULDER

Work 6 [4:6:4:6:6] rows casting off 4 [4:5:5:6:6] sts in patt at beg of next and every foll alt row.

9 [15:12:18:12:14] sts.

Work 2 [4:2:4:2:2] rows casting off 4 [5:6:6:6:7] sts in patt at beg of next and foll 0 [2nd:0:2nd:0:0] row. 5 [5:6:6:6:7] sts.

Cast off rem 5 [5:6:6:6:7] sts in patt. With rs facing, working on rem 55 [59:63:66:67:69] sts, slip 27 [29:29:31:29:29] sts onto a stitch holder, rejoin yarn to rem 28 [30:34:35:38:40] sts and patt to end.

Next Row. Patt.

Work 2 rows dec I st at neck edge in every row. 26 [28:32:33:36:38] sts.

Work 9 [9:9:9:11:11] rows dec I st at neck edge in next and every foll alt row. 21 [23:27:28:30:32] sts.

Work 2 [2:6:6:4:4] rows without shaping.

Work 6 [4:6:4:6:6] rows casting off 4 [4:5:5:6:6] sts in patt at beg of next and every foll alt row.

9 [15:18:18:20:14] sts.

Work 2 [4:2:4:2:2] rows casting off 4 [5:6:6:6:7] sts in patt at beg of next and foll 0 [2nd:0:2nd:0:0] row. 5 [5:6:6:6:7] sts.

Cast off rem 5 [5:6:6:7] sts in patt.

SLEEVES (Both alike)

Using 3½mm needles and thumb method cast on 47 [49:53:55: 57:59] sts, work in 1x1 rib for 6cm, (2½in), ending with a rs row.

Next Row. Rib 5 [3:4:1:5:10], inc in next st, (rib 11 [5:3:3:2:1], inc in next st) 3 [7:11:13:15:19] times,

rib 5 [3:4:1:6:10]. 51 [57:65:69:73:79] sts.

Change to 4mm needles and working in double moss-st (throughout) inc I st at each end of 5th and every foll I0th [10th:10th:12th:12th:12th] row to 57 [63:69:89:93:99] sts, working inc sts in patt.

For 1st, 2nd and 3rd sizes only Inc 1 st at each end of every foll 12th row to 71 [77:85] sts.

For all 6 sizes

Cont without shaping until sleeve measures 49 [49:50:51:51:51]cm, $(19\frac{1}{4} [19\frac{1}{4}:19\frac{3}{4}:20:20:20]in)$, ending with a ws row.

SHAPE SLEEVE TOP

Cast off 8 [8:9:9:10:10] sts in patt at beg of next 2 rows.

55 [61:67:71:73:79] sts.

Work 2 rows dec I st at each end of every row. 51 [57:63:67:69:75] sts.
Work 32 [34:36:38:40:44] rows dec I st at each end of next and every foll alt row.

19 [23:27:29:29:31] sts.

Work 2 [2:2:4:4:4] rows dec I st at each end of every row.

15 [19:23:21:21:23] sts.

Cast off 4 [5:6:5:5:6] sts in patt at beg of next 2 rows. 7 [9:11:11:11:11] sts.

Cast off rem 7 [9:11:11:11:11] sts in patt.

NECKBAND

Join right shoulder seam. With rs facing, using 31/4mm needles pick up and knit 23 [23:25:25:25] sts evenly along left side of neck, knit across 27 [29:29:31:29:29] sts left on a stitch holder at front of neck as follows:k12 [13:13:14:13:13], k2tog, k13 [14: 14:15:14:14], pick up and knit 23 [23: 25:25:25] sts evenly along right side of neck, pick up and knit 7 sts evenly along right side of back neck, knit across 37 [39:39:41:41:41] sts left on a stitch holder at back of neck as follows:- k|| [||:||:|2:|2:|2], k2tog, (k|| [|2:|2:|2:|2], k2tog, k|| [|2: 12:13:13:13] and pick up and knit 7 sts evenly along left side of back neck. 121 [125:129:133:131:131] sts. Starting with 2nd row of 1x1 rib work 4cm, (1½in). Cast off in rib.

TO MAKE UP

Join left shoulder and neckband seams. Fold sleeves in half lengthways then placing folds to shoulder seams, sew sleeves in position. Join side and sleeve seams. Fold neckband to wrong side and slip stitch loosely in position. Pin out garment to the measurement given. Cover with damp cloths and leave until dry. See ball band for washing and further care instructions.
